31ST MAY 2023 - CELEBRATING THE ROYAL BRUNEI ARMED FORCES 62ND ANNIVERSARY

The Royal Brunei Armed Forces' 62nd anniversary will be celebrated on 31st May this year, with the Royal Brunei Air Force (RBAirF) having the honour of hosting the celebration at Rimba Air Force Base. A Grand Parade will be held at the RBAirF's Sports Complex field, which will be followed by a Capability Static Display showcasing the RBAF's current capabilities and equipment. A building and infrastructure display under the 11th and 12th National Development Plan will also be displayed.

The Grand Parade, held to commemorate the RBAF's establishment for 62 years, will be graced by His Majesty Paduka Seri Baginda Sultan Haji Hassanah Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddin Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam along with members of the Royal Family.

This year's celebration theme, 'Bersama Menjayakan Wawasan Negara' (Together In Accomplishing The National Vision), is in alignment with Brunei Darussalam's National Day theme 'Menjayakan Wawasan Negara'. This is envisioned to be a continuity to unceasingly solidify the RBAF's cooperation and efforts in carrying out Brunei Darussalam's National Vision 2035.

The theme is also consistent with the RBAF's roles in supporting progress and the nation's development holistically, in ensuring a peaceful and safe environment through decisive security and defence.

In manifesting the theme, the RBAF is the nation's main pillar for defence and security, being an agent and catalyst for integration and unity with other government security agencies for solidifying the nation's peace and stability, and at the same time contribute to the well-being regionally and internationally.

This year's celebration concept will showcase personnel professionalism along with the RBAF's development in capability, at the same time fostering defence diplomacy in upholding holistic defence. A unique addition to the concept will be a Defence Industry Static Display and participation of an Air Capability Static Display.

Participating in the Air Capability Static Display will be air forces from the Republic of the Philippines, Republic of Indonesia, Malaysia, Republic of Singapore, Australia, the United States of America and the United Kingdom. These invited air forces have existing Air Working Groups with the RBAirF and armed forces based in Brunei Darussalam.

The theme for this year's anniversary celebration is "Together in Achieving the National Vision," aligning with Brunei Darussalam's 39th National Day theme, which is "Achieving the National Vision." This theme corresponds to the role of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces, which supports the comprehensive progress and development of the country by ensuring a secure and peaceful environment through precise defence and security measures.

The logo, featuring a round shape and a white background, represents purity and peace, reflecting the national philosophy of Malay Islamic Monarchy (MIB). The circular shape signifies the defence of Brunei Darussalam by the Royal Brunei Armed Forces.

The Brunei Malay Regiment emblem, established in 1961, incorporates the Royal Brunei Armed Forces stripes, symbolizing the progression, positive yet sustainable development, and operational effectiveness of the present Armed Forces. The Royal Brunei Armed Forces plays a significant role in defending the Sovereignty of the King and supporting the Malay heritage based on the prominent religion of Islam.

This year's anniversary celebration logo commemorates the 62 years of establishment of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces, symbolizing the continuous growth of the armed forces and the unwavering readiness to defend sovereignty, peace, and stability of the nation.

AIR CAPABILITY STATIC DISPLAY

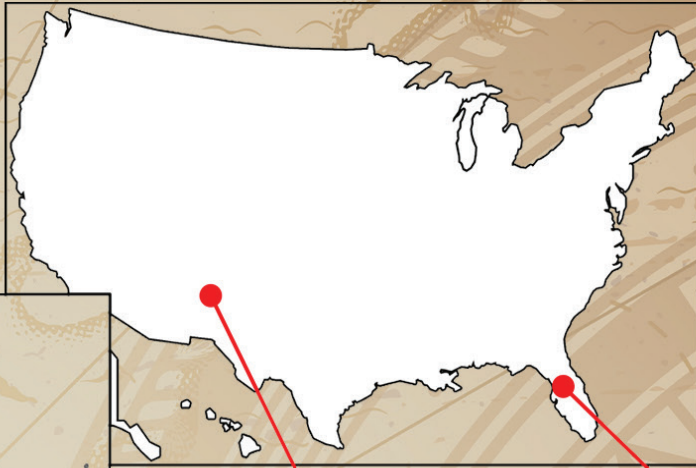

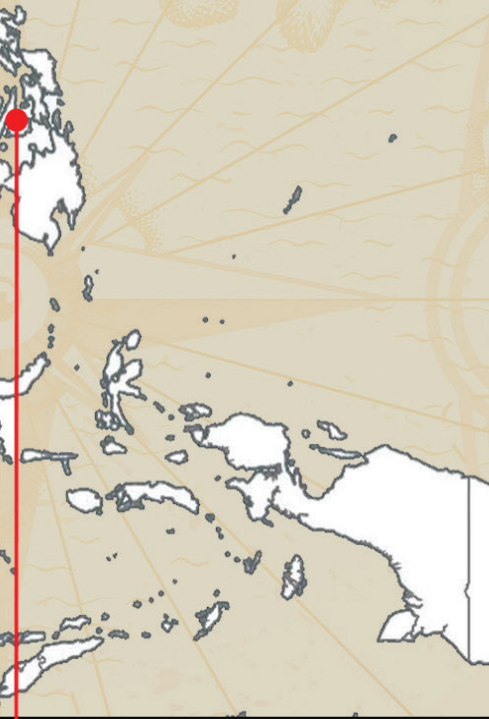

Alhamdulillah Rabbil 'Alameen, Wabihee Nasta'enu 'Alaa Umuuriddunya Wadden, Wassalaatu' Wassalaamu 'Ala Asyarafil Mursaleen, Sayyidina Muhammaddin, Wa'ala Aalihee Wasahbihee Ama'een, Waba'du.

Alhamdulillah bersyukur kita ke hadrat Allah SWT kerana dapat hadir bersama-sama pada pagi ini bagi meraikan Sambutan Hari Ulang Tahun Angkatan Bersenjata Diraja Brunei Yang Ke-61. Beta sangat berbangga dan gembira menyaksikan mutu kawad yang ditunjukkan oleh para peserta perbarisan yang sekaligus melambangkan tahap profesionalisme dan semangat kepahlawanan yang tinggi.

Beta juga telah dan sedang mengikuti perkembangan ABDB sepanjang penubuhannya lebih enam dekad yang lalu, baik dari sudut keupayaan anggota mahupun aset dan kelengkapan yang

membolehkannya kekal sebagai institusi pertahanan yang teguh termasuk usaha pemodenannya yang berterusan.

Beta sedia mengambil maklum bahawa ABDB juga sedang merangka perancangan strategiknya berdasarkan "*Defence White Paper 2021*" yang digabungkan dengan *Force 2035* dan *Force Structure Review* yang masih dikemaskini sebagai panduan dan hala tuju seiring dengan konsep TEPIDOIL iaitu Training, Equipment, People, Information, Doctrine Organization, Structure dan Logistic yang bersesuaian bagi memastikan inisiatif inisiatif yang dikenalpasti dapat dicapai dengan baik.

Dalam perkara permodenan ini beta pada hemat beta, perancangan yang titih dan kemas sangatlah diperlukan untuk mengatasi sebarang kekurangan atau untuk menutupi jurang jurang kepincangan yang ada. Inilah sasaran utama masa depan untuk dipenuhi. Dalam merangka perancangan ABDB juga adalah perlu untuk mempunyai *Defence Posture*

yang jelas sesuai dengan keupayaan dan kapasiti ABDB sambil memperkasa pendekatan *Whole Of Nation* dalam *Context Holistic Defence*. Dalam erti kata lain, ABDB perlu terus bekerjasama dengan agensi-agensi kerajaan yang berkepentingan dalam sama sama mempertahankan kedaulatan negara, khususnya sempadan daratan, kawasan maritim dan ruang udara.

Melihat kepada peranan ABDB dan persediaan untuk mencapai Gagasan Angkatan 2035 nanti, maka mengambil sukut baik Hari Ulang Tahun ABDB Yang Ke-61 ini beta dengan sukacita mentauliahkan Squadron 39 *Unmanned Aerial System* (UAS) bagi Tentera Udara Diraja Brunei dan memperkenankan Penubuhan Squadron Bot Tempur dan Trup Risik bagi Tentera Darat Diraja Brunei dan sehubungan dengannya, beta juga sukacita memperkenankan Jawatan Pemerintah Medan Tentera Darat Diraja Brunei dan seterusnya menaiktaraf Jawatan Ketua Staf Tentera Laut Diraja Brunei, Ketua Staf Tentera Udara Diraja Brunei ke pangkat Kolonel iaitu sebanding dengan Unit Tentera Darat Diraja Brunei dan Markas Angkatan Bersama Angkatan Bersenjata Diraja Brunei ketika ini.

Selain daripada memperkasa kekuatan fizikal, beta ingin mengulangi lagi peringatan akan pentingnya pembinaan kekuatan spritual dan sehubungan itu, beta gembira dengan penerbitan Mushaf Al-Quran Sempena Sambutan Jubli Intan ABDB baru-baru ini. Beta yakin, dengan niat ikhlas mengagungkan Kitab suci Al-Quran, semua anggota ABDB yang beragama Islam akan beroleh berkat celik Al-Quran dengan suka belajar dan menjadikan membaca Al-Quran itu sebagai amalan harian. Bagi kita orang Islam, mendekati diri kepada Allah melalui pembacaan Al-Quran adalah satu kekuatan berdasarkan Al-Quran itu adalah mukjizat teragung yang tidak boleh ditundukkan oleh apa pun.

Lalu sesuai dengan tujuan untuk memperkasa sekuriti maka untuk membaca Al-Quran wajarlah dilazimi bagi meraih keberkatan berupa kekuatan dan keselamatan disamping jangan pula leka atau lalai

dari menangani sebarang kepincangan yang boleh melemahkan kredibiliti ABDB.

Tidak kurang pentingnya juga, untuk diteruskan ialah komitmen, komitmen negara kepada keselamatan serantau dan antarabangsa, penglibatan ABDB dalam misi pengaman dan pemantau melalui *International Monitoring Team* sejak 2004, *United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon* sejak tahun 2008,

Information Fusion Centre (IFC) sejak tahun 2013 dan *International Decommissioning Body (IDB)* sejak tahun 2019 di Republik Filipina serta penugasan di dalam *Counter-Terrorism Information Facility (CTIF)* sejak tahun 2020 di Republik Singapura telah menaikkan profesionalisme anggota Angkatan Bersenjata Diraja Brunei dan sekaligus mengharumkan nama negara. Beta yakin dengan wujudnya rantau yang selamat maka negara kita juga pasti selamat dimana dengan itu rancangan pembangunan dan kemajuan negara akan dapat dilaksanakan dengan lancar dan berkesan.

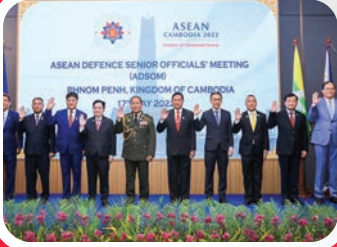

DRONES IN RBLF

THE NAVY'S FULL MISSION BRIDGE SIMULATOR (FMBS)



Navigation is the ability of directing a vessel from one place to another desired destination by determining its position, the course to steer, the intended speed to be used, and the time it takes to travel such distance. It is also the ability to find safe routes to the desired destinations, avoiding collision with nearby vessels and other navigational hazards, as well as meeting schedule. In the early days, the main concern of a navigator is to find safe passage from one place to another, hence they keep records of their observations and findings which would eventually become collective information that can be retraced and integrated into a body of reliable information. Nowadays, as traffic density increases significantly, collision avoidance and finding ways to maintain a safe distance with other vessels moving in different directions became the emphasis. Different ships have different characteristics and capabilities, which is also another challenge that a navigator must understand. For example, a large ship can be easily seen at a distance, however, due to its large size it may require more time to increase her speed and to change her course. A navigator also needs to understand that when transiting through heavily trafficked area, an evasive action made by one vessel to avoid collision may lead to another risk of collision with another vessel.

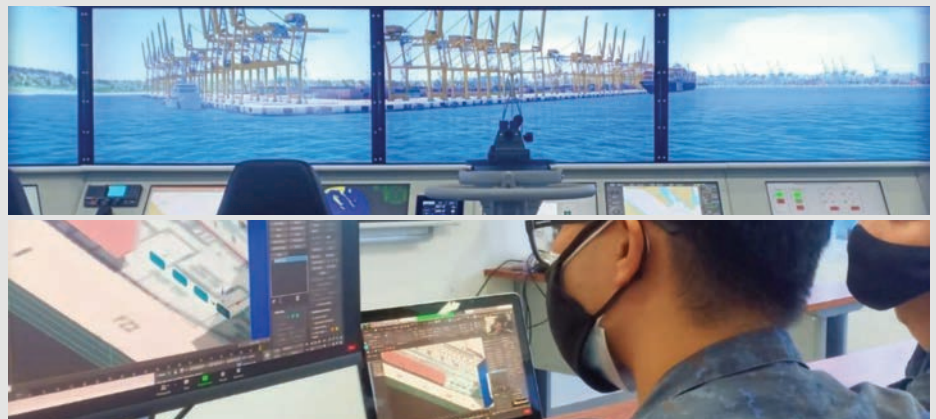

The Royal Brunei Navy (RBN) is not exempted from these challenges. The FMBS is equipped and installed with equipment that are currently installed in RBN Ships such as the Electronic Chart Display and Information System (ECDIS), Navigation Radar,

The simulator also allows for crew resource management training that provides 'whole ship' evolution training and facilitates communications between bridge team and the engineering department. Communication and coordination between teams/departments is really important when a ship is experiencing any breakdowns or malfunctions. Hence the integration of such training to the simulator is necessary to prepare RBN sailors to react accordingly to any situations. Navigation is not an easy task as there are many conditions that a navigator has to consider before and when going out at sea.



and many more that further enhances the training quality of RBN personnel. The simulator also provides a platform for RBN personnel to be trained in bridge team resource management. Such training ensures that trainees can form up a competent bridge teams, ensure all members are aware of their roles and responsibilities, recognise potential threats of a situation and make decisions which maintain the safety of the vessel, interpret and make efficient use of ship's manoeuvring data, and many more.

RBN will ensure that their sailors are competent and are well equipped with the knowledge and skills that would allow to navigate in any situations safely. With the establishment of the FMBS, it provides a safe environment for RBN sailors to hone their skills and brings out their full potential to bear in actual operations. Furthermore, with the FMBS, RBN sailors can learn from the mistakes that they have made and be trained without risking human life as well as RBN assets.



INTRODUCTION OF THE UAS

THE UNVEILING

On 31st of May 2021, the RBAF celebrated its 60th Anniversary where the Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) was also officially unveiled. A Grand Parade was held at Taman Sir Muda Omar 'Ali Saifuddin, which was then followed by the viewing of the exhibition of RBAF's new assets by His Majesty and members of the Royal Family. This was then continued with the unveiling of the UAS through the launching of the UAS Integrator by His Majesty at the Brunei Arts and Handicraft Centre Bandar Seri Begawan.

At the event, a brief presentation was conducted by the project manager of Insitu, Tim Brown followed by a demonstration by two RBAirF operators using the UAS simulator.



EXPERIENCE DURING ACQUISITION

As part of the preparation for the acquisition of the UAS, several meetings took place within the Integrated Project Team (IPT) which discussed the preparation and acquisition strategy of the UAS.

The strategy also included the site setup and infrastructure validation, establishment of power, water and telecommunication utilities as well as the retrieval of the correct map format from the Survey Department. The IPT also coordinated with the Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) in pursuing airspace management for the UAS. Administrative work in coordinating the movement of the Insitu personnel to Brunei was also done in line with the Covid-19 SOPs. With the presence of the Insitu personnel in Brunei, the acquisition of the UAS commenced through a Site Acceptance Test (SAT), a significant portion of the User Requirements Document (URD).

SITE ACCEPTANCE TEST (SAT)

The SAT was composed of a single sortie and was performed on Wednesday, 09 June 2021, with the launching initiated on the ground by the Deputy Commander of RBAirF. The SAT is performed by Insitu personnel at Bukit Agok hub and Rimba Spoke as per the base test requirement defined in the SAT. While performing the demonstration, a flight test card addressing all 73 requirements was checked by qualified operators from the RBAirF.

Following the launch, a high-pass for recovery to validate the approach setup was done simultaneously with a check-in with the Air Traffic Controller to validate the transponder functionality prior to departing the area for the purpose of border surveillance. An Air Vehicle (AV) handoff to Rimba took place to demonstrate coverage of two border areas outside Line of Sight (LoS) from Bukit Agok, but within view from Rimba, ten minutes of loiter time were performed at each point of interest which evaluated the system Intelligence Surveillance and Reconnaissance (ISR) capability whilst under Rimba control. Once ISR evaluations were completed, the AV control was then returned to Bukit Agok for the remainder of the sortie.





ROYAL BRUNEI ARMED FORCES PARTICIPATE IN THE 9TH INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION IN MEMORIZING THE HOLY QURAN FOR THE MILITARY PERSONNEL, MAKKAH AL-MUKARRAMAH, THE KINGDOM OF SAUDI ARABIA

Five Royal Brunei Armed Forces (RBAF) officers and personnel participated in the 9th International Competition Memorization of the Holy Quran for military personnel in Makkah Al-Mukarramah, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia on 19 November 2022.

The delegation was led by Commander Haji Ainolnizam bin Haji Ibrahim, RBN, Acting Director of the RBAF Religious Directorate (JAMA'AT). 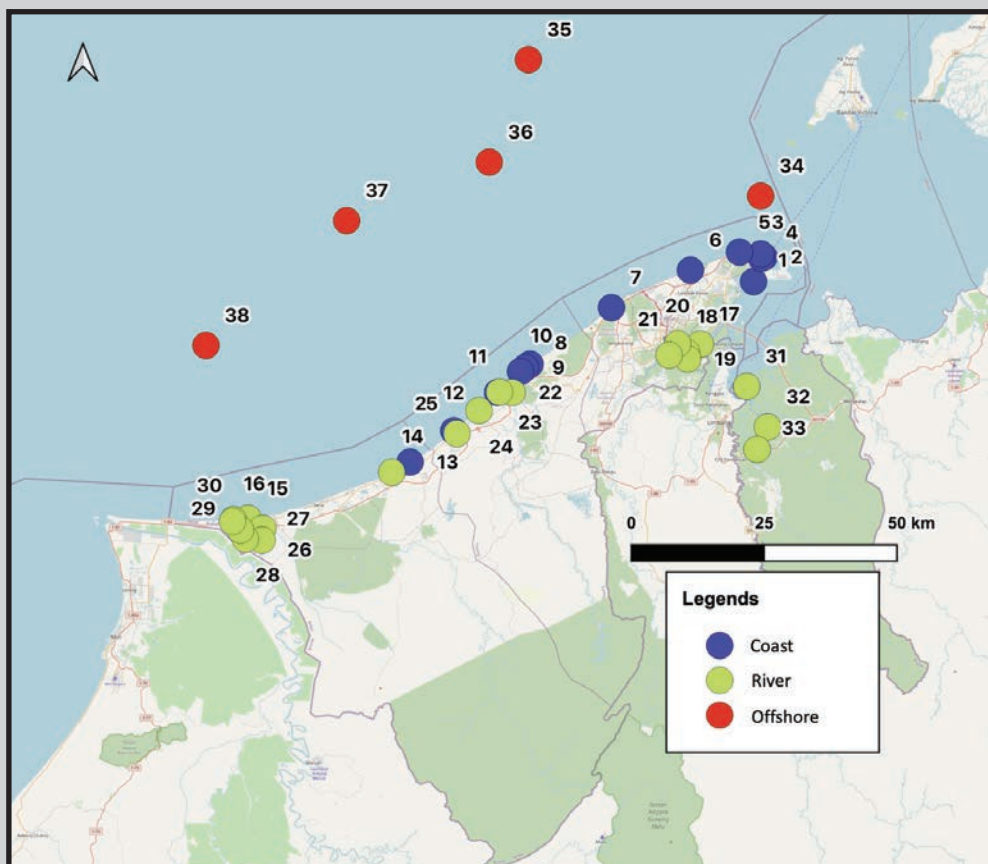
PHYSICOCHEMICAL PROPERTIES OF BRUNEI DARUSSALAM WATERS – THEIR INFLUENCE ON CORROSION RISKS

Corrosion is a prevalent problem in the military on a global scale, with vast amounts of assets and infrastructures vulnerable to the effects of corrosion. The problems affiliated with corrosion negatively affect equipment and infrastructure and can lead to reduced asset availability, deterioration in performance and increasing weapon system and infrastructure costs. A study conducted by the United States Department of Defense, estimated the cost impact of corrosion in the fiscal year 2016 to be USD 20.6 billion. Brunei Darussalam is not an exception, and problems associated with corrosion present great obstacles in the operations of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces (RBAF).

In its general term, corrosion refers to the degradation of a material (usually a metal) as a result of its interaction with its environment. Metals are good conductors of electricity and if the environment with which they are in contact is also conductive, then corrosion will occur via an electrochemical process. Exposure to oxidants (such as oxygen or sulphate) destabilises the properties of the metal, and corrosion consequently converts the refined metal into a more chemically-stable form (such as oxide, hydroxide or sulphide). Natural waters, such as the sea and river, act as an electrolyte and promotes the conduction of electricity, and thus accelerates electrochemical corrosion. Corrosion degrades the useful properties of materials and structures including strength, appearance and permeability to liquids and gases.

Brunei Darussalam is situated on the low-lying coastal area of Borneo Island and its population, infrastructures and developments are principally concentrated around the coastal areas. The sea water



is naturally very aggressive towards most materials. Royal Brunei Armed Forces (RBAF) bases have also been built along the coastline, leaving them vulnerable to corrosion, which is particularly persistent in the Royal Brunei Navy (RBN) and Royal Brunei Air Force (RBAirF). Naval military operations naturally have constant exposure to corrosion as they principally operate and navigate in the sea and river. A steel ship loses structural strength since corrosion reduces the thickness of the hull plates, bulkheads, beams and decks, particularly in aged ships. The aircrafts do not have constant contact with sea water during aerial operations, but they get exposed to sprays of seawater during operations or drills when the aircrafts hover near the sea.

Repairing equipment affected by corrosion is not only expensive, but it also requires some downtime and hinders asset availability.

In Brunei Darussalam, various researches have been made on this corrosion issue, but existing corrosion studies have been focused mainly on post-corrosion remedies, such as corrosion coatings. Water quality studies in Brunei Darussalam are conducted regularly by the Water Services Department, the Fisheries Department and the Department of Environment, Park and Recreation, but they are conducted on selected areas of operations and none of these water quality studies are linked with corrosion.

In this study, physicochemical properties of Brunei Darussalam waters relating to corrosion were investigated. To achieve the objectives of this study, fieldwork was performed for the direct sampling and analyses from 38 test points, which include coastal, riverine and offshore areas. Water parameters such as water temperature, salinity, conductivity and resistivity, total dissolved solids and pH were determined. The findings suggest that variations in physicochemical parameter levels are mainly attributed to distances from water sources, industries and pollution. All coastal and offshore military activities and infrastructure must undergo frequent maintenance to ensure minimal effects of corrosion. Military activities in Brunei River and Tutong River in particular should be underscored in terms of their elevated risk of corrosion.

From this study, it was found that all coastline and deeper offshore waters have high salinity, TDS and conductivity levels. For riverine areas, Brunei River and Tutong River have relatively higher salinity, Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) and conductivity levels compared to Belait River and Temburong River. Additionally, it was also observed that the Belait River is slightly acidic with lower pH levels, making it more vulnerable to the effects of corrosion.

The RBAF should exercise caution when planning operations in these areas, and maintenance requirements should be taken into consideration when considering the frequency of these activities so as to not aggravate

Figure 1: Map of selected test points for investigation of Brunei water properties

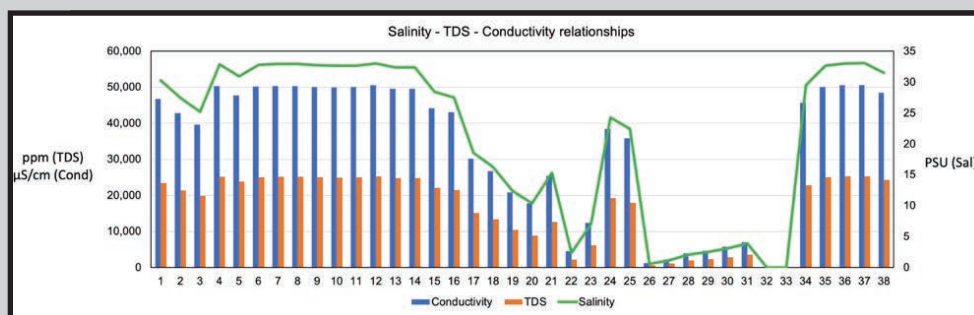


Figure 12: Relationships between salinity, TDS and Conductivity levels

the risk of accelerated corrosion on their operational platforms. The corrosion-related physicochemical parameters must be constantly studied and monitored to ensure minimal risk of corrosion.

The accelerated corrosion experienced on the relevant operational platforms owned by the RBAF may possibly be due to a limited understanding of the local and regional South China Sea water properties by the original equipment manufacturer (OEM). Local water salinities may be influenced by local activities. Dredging works by nearby industries such as petrochemical plants close to Muara Naval Base may have accelerated the salinisation process by increasing the volume of area the seawater can enter through. The continuous global sea level rise as a by-product of climate change is a huge cause of concern for Brunei Darussalam, as an island nation with our national infrastructures and resources located along the coast, including RBAF military bases – notably the Muara Naval Base, the Berakas Garrison and the Penanjong Garrison. As the sea levels rise, the “salt front” (location of the freshwater-saltwater line) may progress further upstream. This increasing risk of salt water intrusion, in turn, will lead to elevated corrosion threats.

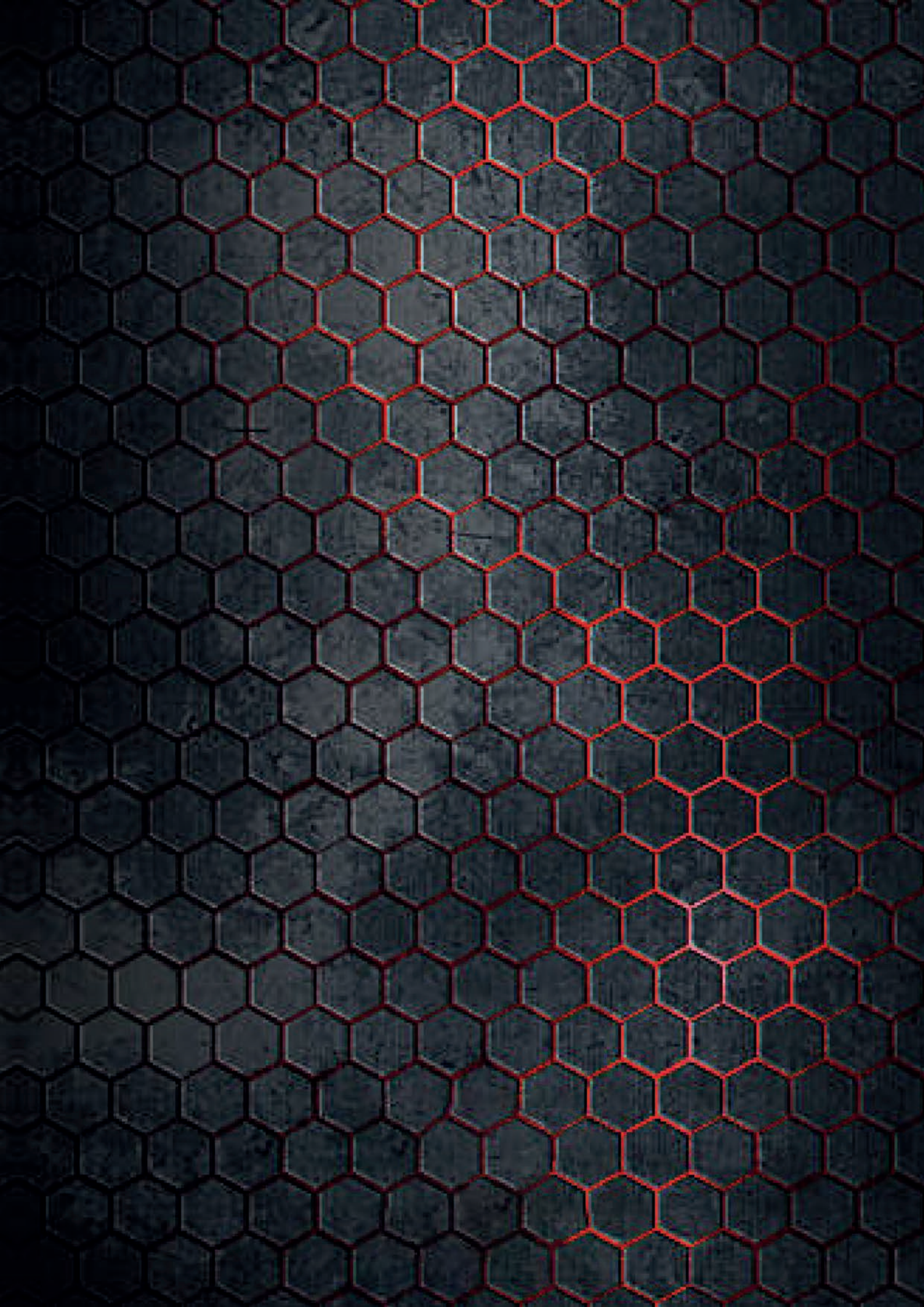
