CURRENT ISSUE

Luring Southeast Asian Fighters to IS: The Case of Former GAM Fighters



Islamic State is expanding its ferocious wings across its borders, and convenient is when the former fighters GAM (Free Aceh Movement) in Aceh is seeking for an escape from daily struggle. With that excuse in the bag for supporting the IS, it is enough to shake the stability of ASEAN region.

After its disbandment in 2005, following the peace agreement between the separatist movement and the Indonesian government, many former GAM felt they did not benefit from the peace. This is as stated by the leader of a GAM faction in July 2015, Fakhruddin bin Kasem @ Din Robot. In which, he explained the former fighters are struggling to provide their families and that his motivation to take the pledge of allegiance to IS, is purely economic. However, he is yet to take that route and desisted from launching a military struggle in Aceh as this would harm local Muslims.

Despite their unwillingness to launch an armed struggle in Indonesia, it seemed that they would however support a jihad in Iraq and Syria. The establishment of the Katibah Nusantara and its military victory over the Iraqi Kurdi in April 2015 would confirm the existence of a successful Indonesian jihadi unit.

With the many possible reasons for the participation, it still comes down to the effectiveness of IS propaganda in winning new recruits.

Ideological issue seems to be another reason for supporting IS which could be another pull factor for the Acehnese and other similar jihadists' associates to become the next IS recruits. On another note, internally displaced communities or refugees could also find similar reasons to join the movement.

The statement by the former GAM fighters may indicate as an early warning for future disturbances in Southeast Asia. Therefore, the leaders have to make thorough preparations and robust measures to prevent such events from happening. Taking note on the danger of Katibah Nusantara's returnees who are skilled in combat and military prepared, acting as fuel to the flames of the people who are self-radicalised and trapped in their desperate conditions.

The results were based on questions that are eventually charted for statistical observation, and the sample questions are as the following:

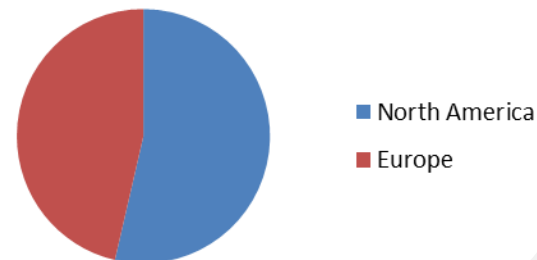
- How will your organization's payroll change in the next 12 months?
- How has the level of competition changed in the last 12 months?
- In 12 months what market position do you expect to be in?
- What market position do you expect your peers to hold in 12 months?

A total of 470 respondents of various professional backgrounds, representing the companies in the participation of the 2015 IHS Jane's World Defence Industry Survey, which was conducted online from 16th April to 8th May 2015. The respondents were to chart confidence, expectations of market movements, the outlook for employment and corporate performance, and views on competition. On top of that, they were encouraged to outline the key

challenges facing their organizations and industries as a whole in the coming 12 months.

The new library will also extend its services to the reservation of rooms for events or any conducting military courses and activities. The rooms to be made available include the mini hall/ lecture room, syndicate rooms and conference room.

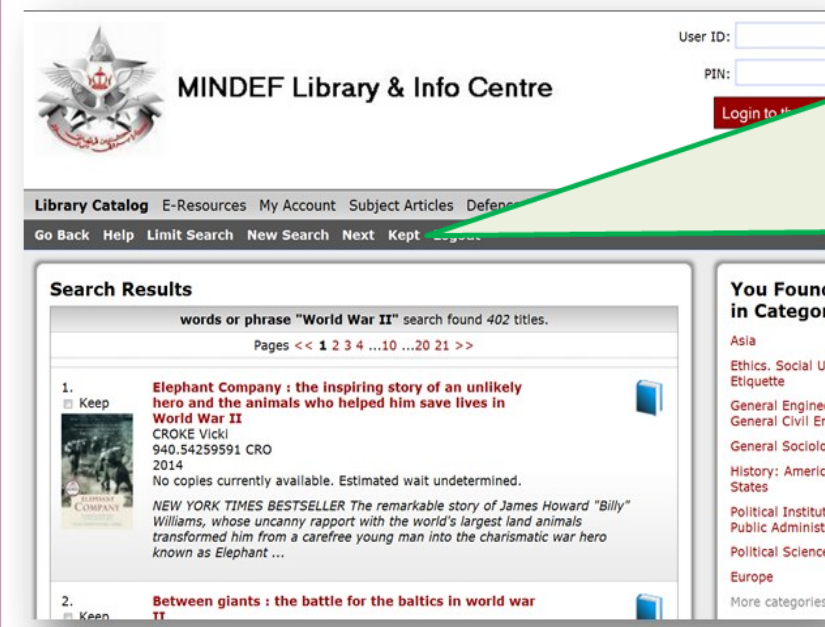

HEALTH & FITNESS

Women who consumed one can a day of a sugary drink had a **75%** higher risk of gout.

More than **70%** of pizzas, pasta mixed dishes and meat mixed dishes had too much sodium to be labelled "healthy".

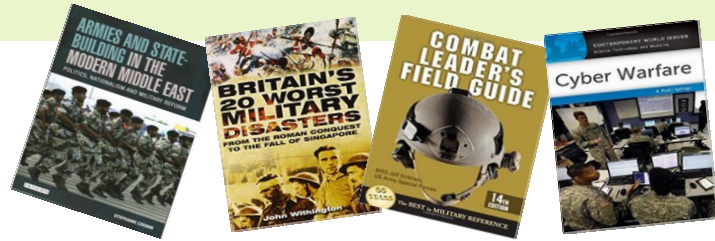
For a healthier gut, eat foods that contain "good bacteria", consider taking probiotic supplement and exercise regularly.

3 easy ways to protect against cancer: eat more plant foods, limit the consumption of processed meats, have one or two cups of green or black tea every day.

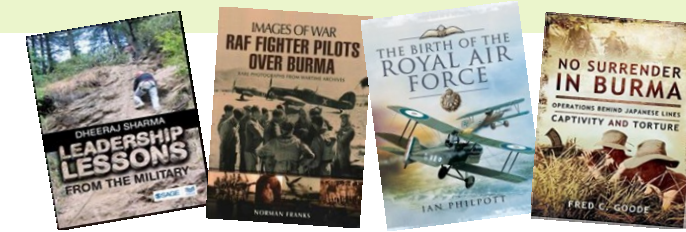
